

The County Spelling Bee dates have been scheduled for: Wednesday, November 2, 4:30, for grades 4-6 (with the location TBA) and


Thursday, November 17, 5:00, for grades 7-8, at the Peterson Event Center in Modesto

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#### "Home-Made" Math Manipulatives

Home-made math manipulatives can be used successfully to build an **abstract** concept from a **concrete** concept. For example all K students are required to identify a number and remember that it has a value. The best way for a student to learn this concept is to give him/her something they can hold in their hands and manipulate to practice identifying a number and attributing a value to that symbol. This realization takes practice, time and a math manipulative! Below you will find a recipe for making a great math manipulative. Enlist the help of your student and have fun!

#### **Dved Noodles**

Materials Needed:

- Food Coloring
- A bag of fun macaroni noodles (uncooked)
- Rubbing Alcohol
- Large Ziploc type bag (Gallon size is perfect)
- Paper Towels
- Cookie sheet
- 1. Dump your bag of noodles into the plastic bag
- 2. Add 3-5 drops of food coloring
- 3. Add 2 Tbls. of rubbing alcohol
- 4. Seal the bag (make sure it is sealed tightly)
- 5. Squeeze and move the noodles around until the color is evenly distributed
- 6. Lay out paper towels onto the cookie sheet
- 7. Spread out the noodles onto the paper towels and let dry

\*You may store the noodles in a plastic container or a clean plastic bag. Have fun making and using these tried and true math manipulatives! For more ideas ask your AT. They will be happy to help ©

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## Using the STAR Test to Your Advantage

Parents, you can find out <u>ANY</u> type of question asked for <u>EVERY</u> subject on the STAR test, grades 2-8. For example:

"My child did poorly on the 4<sup>th</sup> Grade STAR test in math, especially Measurement and Geometry. What types of questions were asked? How can we practice and review?"

1) Follow this link to open the State website:

http://www.cde.ca.gov/ta/tg/sr/css05rtq.asp

- 2) Click on the subject area and grade level needed (all subjects and grades are listed)
  - ex. Math, Grade 4
- 3) First you will see lists of standards assessed with the code given for each part
  - ex. Measurement and Geometry, Standard 4MG1.1 means Grade 4, Measurement and Geometry, standard 1, part 1

It looks like this:

## **CALIFORNIA CONTENT STANDARDS IN THIS STRAND/CLUSTER Measurement and Geometry**

#### Standard Set 1.0 Students understand perimeter and area:

4MG1.1 Measure the area of rectangular shapes by using appropriate units such as square centimeter (cm<sub>2</sub>), square meter (m<sub>2</sub>), square kilometer (km<sub>2</sub>), square inch (in<sub>2</sub>), square yard (yd<sub>2</sub>), or square mile (mi<sub>2</sub>).

4MG1.2 Recognize that rectangles that have the same area can have different perimeters.

- 4) In the middle are <u>practice questions</u> for the student, released from actual STAR tests given years 2003-2008.
- 5) At the end are the problem #s along with which standard was covered.

For example, a student struggling in Measurement and Geometry, we'd look for the questions that had 4MG under it

Question Number Correct Answer Standard Year of Release
71 D 4MG1.1 2007
72 A 4MG1.2 2004
73 A 4MG1.2 2008
74 A 4MG1.3 2007

So it appears that practice questions # 71-74 had to do with measurement and geometry. See if your child is able to answer them. Help and encourage too!
