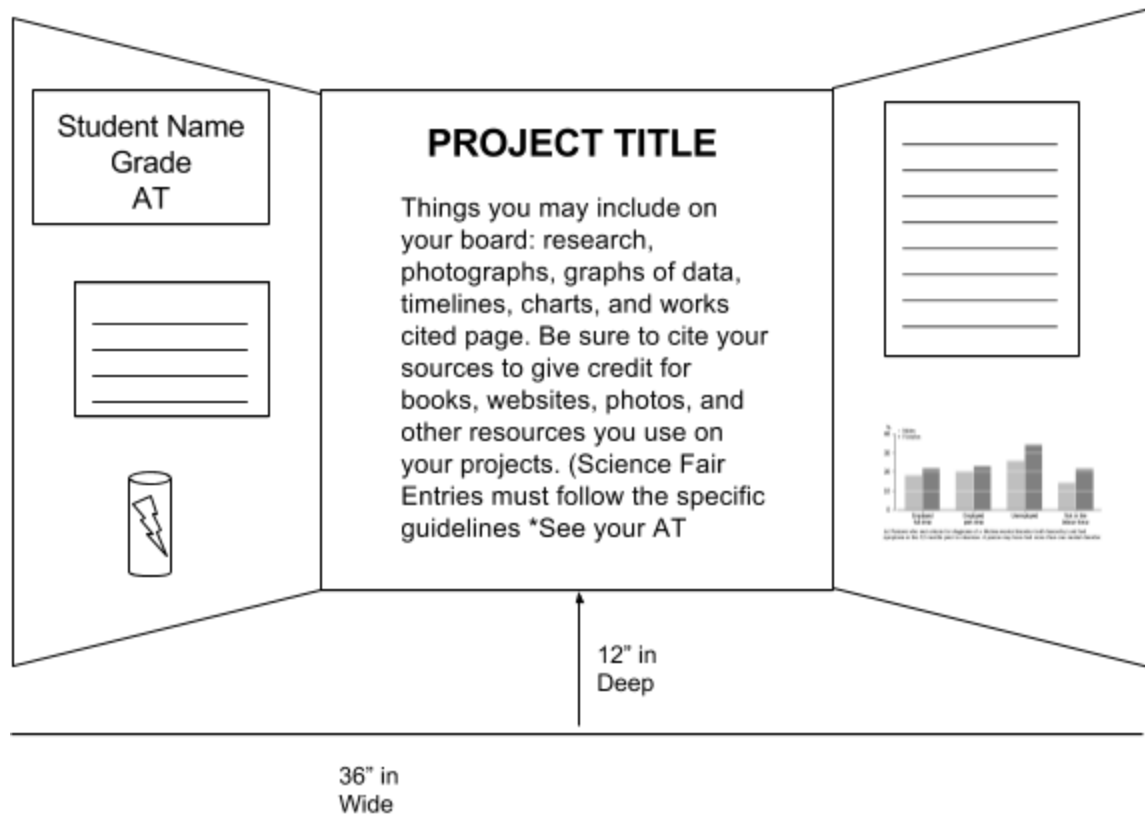


2017 Spring Festival Project Display Guidelines

1. Each student may display only 1 project.
2. Children may work together on a single family or group display.
3. Display boards should not exceed 12" deep by 36" wide.
4. All project boards should have a project title, name, grade and advisory teacher.



5. All display materials, including electronics, are the sole responsibility of the participant; Hart-Ransom is not responsible for lost or stolen items.
6. Dangerous chemicals, drugs, open flames, and explosives may not be part of the project.
7. While food items may be involved in your project, all food must be covered and no tasting or sharing is permitted.
8. Any project requiring electricity should provide a suitable battery, as electrical outlets may not be available. **Electronic displays must be attended at all times.**
9. A project cannot involve either the selling of items or the taking of orders at the Spring Festival.
10. **Plan to set up the project between 5:30-6:00, Thursday, April 27, 2017, in the gym.**
11. Please be respectful of everyone's projects. Unless otherwise stated the projects are not for touching.
12. Projects are to be removed at 7:30 on the night of the event. Everyone is responsible for removing their own projects. Any displays not removed will be discarded.

Construction of a toolbox, birdhouse, etc	Diorama
Model with report	Country report
Collections display ie stamps or bugs	Sewing project
Lego project	Mission project
